Common Property FAQs

What can I have in my car spot?

The answer to this question is simple: Your Car



Car spaces are not to be utilised as storage for pallets, store stock, rubbish or any other material(s). It is a breach of the Strata Laws and subsequently your Lease Terms if you store anything in your car space other than authorised vehicle(s), and fines can apply if you are taken to the Tribunal.

Past occurrences have revealed that car spaces utilised for unintended purposes invite vandalism and/or cause fires which potentially damage the strata complex and/or common property as well as jeopardize costs / coverage for Building Insurance, all of which ultimately leave you responsible for the resulting expenses.

Who is responsible for my garden?

If the garden in question in not on common property, it is the responsibility of the Tenant. It is easy to forget about up-keep as gardens lay dormant in winter, but don't make the costly mistake of waiting until spring to begin your maintenance. Be proactive and start your garden maintenance now to save time and money later.

What to do when your Roof leaks?

- > Identify Location of Leak & Take Pictures
- Contractor Appointment once weather clears

Asbestos becomes a health risk when its fibres are released into the air and breathed in. Breathing in asbestos fibres can cause asbestosis, lung cancer and mesothelioma.

If you manage, or are in control of, a workplace, you have a responsibility to protect anyone and everyone that works with asbestos by ensuring you:

- Have an asbestos register
- Have asbestos management plan
